### **Levels of Involvement in MI ACE**

#### **Women leaders new to MI ACE...**

College students should attend:

- Young Women Strong Leaders (YWSL) conference.

College faculty, staff and administrators should attend:

- MI ACE Annual Conference
- Women of Color Collaborative pre-conference sessions
- Women's Legislative Dinner
- Campus professional development session or workshop sponsored by a Michigan ACE Institutional Representative.

#### **Familiar with MI ACE and seeking more involvement...**

- Volunteer to be the Institutional Representative (IR) for your college/university.
- Submit a presentation proposal for the Annual Conference or YWSL conference.
- Volunteer to serve on one of the MI ACE committees (e.g., marketing/communications, Young Women Strong Leaders, Public Policy, etc.)
- Participate in the MI ACE Women of Color Collaborative
- Organize a professional development workshop or session on your campus under the MI ACE name to recruit new members to MI ACE and build the network among women on your campus.
- Suggest a nominee to your campus President a woman on your campus for a MI ACE Distinguished Women Leader Award

#### **Experienced MI ACE Executive Board member...**

- If you want to expand your leadership role at the state and national levels, ask the Board to nominate you as the Network's State Coordinator!
- If you want to stay engaged at the end of your career, consider serving as an Emerita Executive Board member and determine the extent of your engagement based on time and availability.
